#### Letter to Parents

Along with this theme, we will also be teaching

- One letter of the alphabet. (The letter this week is 'a')
- One number (The number we are teaching is 3).

Feel free to proceed at a pace that suits you and your child, while trying to keep to this broad framework.

Please note the following when implementing this theme:

- We have goals listed for this theme. This will help you assess how much your child has understood. Many of these your child might already know. We do have some information italicized. Please share that with the child only if you think they might be interested or are ready for it.
- 2. There are pictorial teaching aids available to help. Please introduce each insect with the help of these, so that they have a pictorial understanding of what the insect looks like. Some of these insects will be re-taught in other themes also.
- 3. All pictures in the kit are black and white.
- 4. When teaching letters of the alphabet, we teach the letter as well as the sound that the letter makes. Therefore, pls teach them capital 'A', small 'a', and the sound the letter makes which is 'a' (as heard at the beginning of the words ant, apple and alligator).

We hope that both you and your child enjoy exploring this theme together. Do let us know what your child specifically likes and doesn't like, so that we can keep that in mind as we are planning other themes, and make it more exciting.

Where possible, esp. in art and craft, we would love to see what your child has done, so do scan and send us photos if possible. If you come up with ideas that we haven't, we would love to hear of it and how it worked.

# Theme Goals

Your child should be able to <b>name</b> and <b>identify</b> the following: (Please use teaching aid 1 to help you with this)				
Ant	A small insect, which has 3 body parts. Ants can be red or black in colour. Ants walk fast in a straight line. They have 2 antennae on their head, which they use as a nose to smell.			
Ladybug	An insect, which has a red body with black spots on it. Ladybugs can fly using their wings (they move it up and down and forward and backward)			
Spider	An insect, which makes a sticky web. <i>The process of making the web is called spinning</i> . Spiders have 8 legs and 8 eyes.			
Grasshopper	Grasshoppers are usually green in colour. They have wings to fly and long legs for jumping.			
Bees	An insect with a sting that is yellow and black in colour. Bees fly from flower to flower and collect nectar, to make honey. <i>The home of the bee is called a hive.</i>			
Cockroach	An insect that looks a beetle, with long antennae and legs. They are brown in colour and found in houses because they like to be in warm places where there is food and water.			
Caterpillar	An insect <i>(with 16 legs)</i> that eventually becomes a butterfly.			
Butterfly	A beautiful multi-coloured flying insect that starts out as a caterpillar.

## Story Time

#### Art and Craft

#### 1) Spider spinning a web

#### Supplies Needed

A paper plate, black and white paint, twine / thread, homemade playdough, black paper (thin strips)

#### Method

Give the child a paper plate each. Mix some black and white paint to make grey colour and let the children dip the wool into the paint and put it on the paper plate. Doing this repeatedly, all over the paper plate, will give the impression of the spider's web. Using the playdough make 2 oval shapes, one bigger than the other, to make the head and the body of the spider. Cut 8 thin black strips of paper in the shape of a 'v' and put in on the playdough (upside down) to be the legs of the spider.

The eyes of the spider can be made with dhal, urad dhal or peppercorns (or anything else similar to those).

The paper plate can be put on the table and the spider put onto the paper plate.

#### 2) Paper chain caterpillar

#### Supplies Needed

Green paper, scissors, fevicol, black marker / sketch pen

#### Method

Cut out strips of paper about 1 inch thick. Along that strip of paper, every **4**-5 inches, draw a line and give your children the scissors to cut on that line to make a rectangular strip.

You need to have at least 15 cut up rectangular strips of paper.

Once the papers have been cut, help the children to form one strip into a circle and secure it with fevicol.

Slide your next strip through the above circle, and then make another circle so that you have 2 intertwined circles.

Repeat the process with all 15 strips till you have a long chain of paper rings.

Cut out a circle with some more construction paper to make a head for the caterpillar. Draw eyes and sharp teeth with a black marker and stick at one end of your caterpillar chain.

Optional I: Cut out 2 thin strips of paper and curl it with a pencil to make antennae. Stick to the head of the caterpillar.

Optional 2: Cut out a large piece of green chart paper into a shape of a leaf for the caterpillar to rest on.

#### 3) Ladybug Craft

#### Supplies Needed

Paper, Potato, black paint, red paint, marker, green and yellow paper

#### Method

Cut a potato into 2 and let it dry. Then dip it into some red paint and make an imprint of the paper. This is the base for the body of the ladybug. Let the paint dry and then draw a line through the middle with a sketch pen. Get the children to dip their fingers in and make black spots on the body of the ladybug. A larger black finger imprint can be the face of the ladybug and you can help by drawing 2 antennae.

Optional I: Cut out some strips of green and yellow chart as grass. Cut out the ladybugs once they have dried and stick on the grass. Make as many little ladybugs as you want.

## 4) Sticking on 'A' and 'a'

#### <u>Supplies</u>

Art and Craft sheet, I(a-d); glue; rice/noodles/green gram/dhal/sand/crepe paper scrunched up/coloured paper cut up, chapati maav

#### Method

Use any of the raw material mentioned above and stick on the templates of 'A' and 'a'. Do 2 of 'A' on one day (Art & Craft I(a&b)), and 2 of 'a' on another day (Art & Craft I(c&d)).

#### 5) Finger painting on 'a' and 'A'

#### **Supplies**

Art and Craft 2(a&b); paints, water

#### Method

Let the children finger paint on the letter (in the direction of the arrow).

#### 6) Play dough Craft

#### Supplies Needed

Playdough, (optional: food colouring)

#### **Method**

- 1. The playdough can be used to make the letters 'a' and 'A'. Remember to also use the phonetical sound '<u>a</u>', when teaching them the letter.
- 2. The play dough can also be used for counting. Since we are teaching the number 3, the child can learn to make the

number '3' and 3 objects with playdough (art and craft sheet 3).

#### 7) The number 3

#### **Supplies**

Template of number 3 (Art and Craft sheet 4), crayons / paint

#### Method

Let the children colour or paint number 3 (either finger paint or with a paintbrush) or using crayons. Once the paint has dried, help them to cut out the number 3.

#### 8) Ice-cream scoops

#### **Supplies**

Template of the ice-cream cone (Art and Craft sheet 5), coloured paper, crepe paper, cotton, paint, crayons, fevicol

#### **Method**

With crayons, make the cone of the ice cream any colour you want.

Then make any 3 scoops of the ice cream yellow colour. You can use any medium you like – paint it, use crayons, crepe paper crushed, coloured paper cut up, cotton dipped in paint or even waste cloth you have lying at home. But make sure it is yellow colour.

The other 3 scoops, you can do any colour you like. But make 2 one colour and 1 another colour.

#### Home Activities

1) Put some maida / atta /powder on the table and let the children try writing the letters 'A' and 'a' with that. Remember to also use the phonetical sound 'a'. You, the parent can help by showing them how it is done. Please

- make sure you follow the same method we are using (direction and numbering of arrows).
- 2) The child can also be taught to write the letters 'A' and 'a' in the sand, so that they can feel the texture of the sand as they write. Remember to also use the phonetical sound 'a'.
- 3) Give the children the sandpaper piece and help them to write the letter 'a' on it. This will help them get a sensory feel of the letter as they write it.
- 4) Each of these can be repeated with the number 3

#### Puzzles and Worksheets

- 1) Please use worksheet I to count the insects.
- 2) Please use worksheet 2 to cut and arrange the bees in order of size
- 3) Use worksheet 3 to count and colour the spots on the ladybug
- 4) Use worksheet 4 to find out the odd one out in each row
- 5) Please use worksheet 5 to help the bee get from flower to flower
- 6) Use worksheet 6 to find out what comes next

## Scripture

The story of how the caterpillar becomes a butterfly ('The Ant and the Chrysalis') is an indication of how when we ask Jesus into our hearts, he transforms us from a small wriggly worm that eats dirt to a beautiful butterfly that flies around.

## Outdoor Play

1. Get your child to imitate a butterfly and fly around from place to place (landing on different 'flowers' and collecting nectar.

- 2. Let your child pretend to be a caterpillar that wriggles on its tummy.
- 3. Your child can also act out the life cycle of the butterfly from caterpillar to cocoon / chrysalis (lying scrunched up like a fetus) to a butterfly.
- 4. Go for a walk and look for the insects we have been discussing. Draw your child's attention to them how they walk etc.
- 5. Cut out the squares of insects (your child can colour them if they want), and get the child to walk over / around them instead of stepping on them. Make an obstacle course of it. (Outdoor Play Aid: I)

#### 'A' and 'a'

For this week, the child is learning the letters 'A' and 'a'. They make the sound 'a' like in apple, and, alligator, or ambulance.

Please use the teaching aids 2 & 3 (a&b) to teach the child the letters 'A'& 'a', words that start with the letter sound 'a', and words that have the letter sound 'a' in them.

Trace the letter (only) with your finger, and as you trace say the sound the letter makes ( $\dot{a}$ )






## Teaching Aid: 2(a) - Capital letter 'A'


## Teaching Aid: 2(b) - small letter 'a'








